You will notice various changes in the way our casino runs look. We have implemented new practices and protocols. We understand these changes may be difficult and we are here to support you!

The Casino is requiring a temperature check when you arrive at the location. If you have a temperature above the CDC recommended level of 100.4, you will NOT be permitted to enter the casino.

Currently, the best method of control is cloth masks. We will enforce the mask (whatever type the rider feels comfortable in) during the ride to lessen chance for exposure by other passengers and our driver.

Our Driver will be wearing a mask or face covering while providing service.

Hand sanitizer will be available to each passenger as they board the bus. Most are mounted

As a passenger you must follow these rules:

1. Wear a face covering at all times while on the bus AND while waiting at the bus pick -up location. We will have only a few available if you forget. No mask; no service.
2. Do not ride the bus if you feel sick.
3. Assess your health before you arrive at the bus pick up location.
 - a. Do you have signs of a fever? Elevated Temperature, chills or muscle aches?
 - b. Do you have a cough or are you sneezing?
 - c. Have you been in close contact with a confirmed case of COVID-19, and individual being tested for COVID-19 or a person under isolation for COVID-19?

If you answered yes, do not ride the bus.

The driver has the authority to deny service and will ask you these health screening questions as you are boarding or waiting to board.

- a. Do you have signs of a fever? Elevated Temperature, chills or muscle aches?
- b. Do you have a cough or are you sneezing?
- c. Have you been in close contact with a confirmed case of COVID-19, and individual being tested for COVID-19 or a person under isolation for COVID-19?

If you answer yes, you will not be able to ride the bus.

Our goal is to ensure you feel safe and secure so together we can navigate the complexities of our “new normal.”
